

County Voting Resolution

2020 Election: We believe that the 2020 election violated Article 1 and 2 of the US Constitution, that various secretaries of state illegally circumvented their state legislatures in conducting their elections in multiple ways, including by allowing ballots to be received after November 3, 2020.

We believe that substantial election fraud in key metropolitan areas significantly affected the results in five key states in favor of Joseph Robinette Biden Jr. We reject the certified results of the 2020 Presidential election, and we hold that acting President Joseph Robinette Biden Jr. was not legitimately elected by the people of the United States.

We believe that the Nebraska 2020 election was also fraudulent and we recommend that the fraud be recognized and the election repeated before 2024 and all votes or actions by elected officials, elected in 2020, be obviated.

We strongly urge all Nebraskans to work to ensure election integrity and to show up to vote in November of 2022, bring your friends and family, volunteer for your local Republicans, and overwhelm any possible fraud.

We believe that voting fraud was perpetrated in Nebraska by mailing excess ballots to voters and then returning the excess ballots and voting those ballots for people that are registered, but do not normally vote, have moved or have passed away. We do not believe that our County election officials were involved and they cannot detect this type of fraud.

We believe that the Nebraska State Constitution and laws state that Counties are responsible for the administration including registration, voting process, ballot management, vote counting and reporting of their own elections.

Our County should outlaw the use of machines and mail-in voting or registration.

All registration should be in person with a valid ID and proof of citizenship.

All voting should be in person with a valid ID that required, or is, proof of citizenship such as a US birth certificate, naturalization documents or a passport. If Nebraska changes their Driver's license laws to require proof of citizenship and not just sworn statement of citizenship, they could be used in the future.

The only exception for in person voting would be military service or handicapped persons.

Military persons must have their ballots mailed to their military work address.

Handicapped persons must be able to request their ballot either via telephone with voice or through an ADA approved communications device to request the ballot and correctly answer the basic questions, their name, address and date of birth.

Both types of mail in voters must submit a copy of their valid ID with their ballot.

Ballot counting should be completed manually using vote counting persons selected among registered voters, as in jury duty.

Ballot counting should be done in public, at the precinct with web based videocams reviewing and recording each ballot as it is counted.

It is recommended that the Nebraska Guide to Manual Voting be followed as closely as possible.
